Saturday evening- Group dinner at a local eatery.


Sunday, March 5

10 AM till Noon- Sighting-in and practice.

Noon- Pistol/Fun Airgun Shooters Meeting. Match starts 15 minutes after meeting.

ASAP after Pistol/Fun Airgun match- Awards presentation.

Match location- The address is 5636 FM 56, Clifton, Tx. 76634. It's at the intersection of FM 56 and 2490; 4 miles south of the Lake Whitney dam, 30 minutes NW of Waco.

On-site primitive camping is available at the Ranchito Robinson venue at no charge.

Sight-in/practice- See schedule above for practice times. Practice will be from a covered porch with 4 shooting benches, at targets placed at various distances.

Match Courses- All matches will be shot on 9 shooting lanes around the TEXtreme venue. The Extreme Pistol/Fun Airgun target distances are 10-55 yards. The Extreme Rifle target distances are 36-100 yards. Troyer difficulty factors in both match will be in the mid-30s (pistol). Both matches are on 9 lanes, with 6 shots per lane for a total of 48 shots per match. All target distances will be provided.

Scoring- Scoring will be 'X' for targets felled, and '0' for targets that don't fall. Every shot counts on the score-card unless the scorer hears the shooter announce "*Blowing off a shot*". Any trip of the trigger is considered a shot, whether or not a pellet exits.

Power Limits- TEXtreme FT Rifle matches have a strict 100 foot pound energy limit. TEXtreme Pistol/Fun Airgun matches have a strict 20 foot-pound energy limit. All matches allow diablo pellets only. No slugs are allowed.

Entry Fees- The Full-Tournament entry fee (for BOTH matches) is \$50. The Rifle Match (only) entry fee is \$35. The Pistol/Fun Airgun match (only) entry fee is \$25.

Registration and Payment of Match Fees- The Match Director reserves the right to limit number of entries in any match and/or full tournament registrations as safety and circumstances dictate. Any closure of entries will be publicized on the Airgun Nation forum and the TEXtreme email list. Score-cards will be handed out after completed registration forms and match fees are collected at the event. Score-cards will then be filled out by each competitor and returned to the Match Director before each match for squadding purposes. All attendees must sign a liability waiver upon arrival at the event.

General Rules and Shooter Responsibilities- SAFETY is the first and foremost concern at TEXtreme matches at all times! Unsafe gun handling cannot be tolerated, and may result in disqualification or expulsion. Rules exist to insure a SAFE, fair and level playing-field for all. By entering any TEXtreme competition, the shooter accepts full responsibility to know and abide by the rules of safe gun-handling, shooting, and TEXtreme competition rules. Because all rules are rendered moot by non-enforcement of any rule and non-enforcement cheats every shooter in the contest, all stated rules will be strictly enforced. Shooters are advised to ask the Match Director for clarification of any rule not well understood, always err on the side of safe gun-handling caution at all times, and keep their rigs comfortably within rules parameters and power limits.

Shooting and Equipment Rules- The Extreme Field Target Rifle and Pistol/Fun Rifle matches will follow the respective rules sets below. In situations not covered in the rules, the Match Director will have final say; said Match Director driven by safety, logic, reason, fair play, simplicity, and Majority good.

Ranchito Robinson TEXtreme Field Target Rifle Rules

Entering a match signifies the shooter agrees to abide by these rules-

All lead diabolo pellets only; no slugs allowed. Maximum caliber is .30, maximum muzzle energy 100 foot pounds.

Maximum scope magnification is 32X. If the scope has no 32X factory marking, magnification must be set no higher than the next lower factory marking.

Minimum kill-zone size is 1". Minimum target distance is no less than 20 yards.

Maximum target kill-zone size is 4". Maximum target distance is no more than 100 yards. Kill zones may be of various shapes. Target distances are provided.

Rangefinders and anemometers are allowed.

Mono-pods, bi-pods, and shooting sticks are allowed. The legs must rest on the ground, but may not be driven into the ground. Mono-pods, bi-pods, and shooting sticks cannot be attached to the stock, and must fall free when the rifle is picked up. No tri-pods are allowed.

Bum bags and shooting seats are allowed, but no arm rests or back rests are allowed on shooting seats. Shooting seats may not be used to rest the rifle. No other stabilizing accessories or movement-restricting clothing are allowed (such as rifle slings, shooting gloves, and shooting vests or jackets).

Maximum fore-end depth allowed is 6", as measured from the center of the barrel to the bottom of the fore-end.

Adjustable stock components may not be adjusted during a match. No butt-hooks or thigh rests allowed. Adjustable wings on butt-pads cannot exceed 30°. Shooting lanes feature two targets per lane. Shooters shoot targets in near to far order. Except for announced blow-off shots heard by the scorer, all shots count on the score-card. Only the Match Director has authority to make exceptions. Scoring format is 'X' for shots that fell the target, and 'O' for shots that do not fell the target. Upon completing the course of fire, scorers will add all Xs to determine competitors' scores, then sign the score-cards. Competitors will then examine their score-cards for accuracy; and when satisfied, also sign their score-cards. Signing your scorecard signifies your agreement that the score on your card is correct, and you surrender further recourse in scoring disputes. Tie-breakers are (in order) - 1) Shoot-off, if agreed by tied competitors. 2) Most cleaned lanes. 3) High standing lane score. 4) Coin flip. 5) Pissin' match.

EXtreme Field Pistol Target Rules

1. Air pistols only. The maximum caliber is .25.
2. Muzzle energy is limited to 20 foot-pounds.
3. Barrel length including shroud and muzzle attachments is limited to 15 inches. Barrel length is measured from the tip of the barrel or muzzle attachment to the breech-face.
4. Fore-end depth is limited to a maximum of 3 inches, as measured from the center-line of the bore to the lowest part of the gun forward of the trigger guard.
5. Attached cylinders at the rear of the pistol are not allowed.
6. Overall length including any attachments cannot exceed 25 inches.
7. No shooting jackets, slings, harnesses, or other bodily supports. Clothing or shooting gloves worn by the shooter must not restrict hand or body movement.
8. Unattached shooting sticks, monopods and bipods are allowed. No tripods allowed.
9. Kneepads may not exceed 1 inch in thickness.
10. Sandbags, knee risers, and butt stocks are not allowed.
11. Scope maximum magnification is 12X. Variable scopes capable of greater than 12X are allowed, but must be set to no higher than a 12X factory marking. Absent a 12X factory marking, scopes must be set no higher than the next lower factory marking. Clicking is allowed.
12. Bum-bags and seats are allowed that allow no form of arm or hand support.
13. Time limits may be enforced.
14. Any shooting position is allowed so long as the pistol is fully supported only by the competitor and a monopod, bipod, or natural vegetation. Hangy-tanks are not allowed.
15. Target distances may be anywhere between 10 and 55 yards.
16. Kill zone sizes shall measure no less than .5", no larger than 4", and may be of any shape.
17. Forced Standing Shots- Other than an unattached monopod, bipod, or natural rest (trees, limbs, etc.), pistols are held solely by the hands, and may not contact the arms or any other part of the body.
18. Light eyecup contact with the face is permitted.
19. Classes- There will be at least one class per match. Other classes may be added as needed to accommodate at least three shooters in a given match.
Current TEXtreme PFT classes are: A) Pistolero Class: Rules as defined above. B) Bandito Class: No shooting sticks, monopods or bipods allowed.
20. Pistol Rear Attachments- Allowed: Rear-mounted Power Adjuster. Reasoning: A power adjuster is an integral part of the gun that does not provide additional support. Not Allowed: Rear-mounted air cylinders or buffer tubes to fit a butt stock. Reasoning: May provide additional support and weight ballast behind the grip of the gun.
